



Overcoming Barriers...An ErieDAWN Client's Success Story

Beth immigrated to the United States from Southeastern Asia about ten years ago. She was married to a man who was very abusive. Beth found the courage to leave her abuser and seek a better life for herself and her daughter. She fled with her ten-year old daughter and sought shelter with the SafeNet Bridge Program. As Beth was approaching six months in the Bridge Program she reached out to Erie DAWN, through her counselor, for information about our Rapid Rehousing Program. Even though she is fluent in her homeland language and knew little English, she managed to let us know her needs. She was seeking housing and budgeting assistance as she had limited funds and could not afford to pay the high cost of rent and security deposit that local landlords required.



Over this past year through the pandemic, Beth was able to go from working in a temporary position to being hired full-time at a manufacturing company. She has an incredible work ethic! Beth gets up at 4:30 AM and drives over 25 miles to work and back every day. She often picks up overtime and sometimes weekends. One of the first questions we asked Beth was, "Why do you want to be in the Erie DAWN program and what do you hope to accomplish? Her response was, "To save money and have my own place."

We are so proud of Beth. Not only has she gained permanent full-time employment, but she has just put a down payment on a home that is soon to be hers! The staff at Erie DAWN describe Beth as appreciative, proud, kind and a model participant. Beth eagerly said, "I am happy and thankful that Erie DAWN has taken care of me and my daughter. I was able to save money for my home. Thank you for the opportunity to be in the Erie DAWN Program. The staff are very good people. I will never forget them!"
